








Girard's Modern Folk



- Bartlett Library & Archives most frequent research requests relate to Girard and the Girard collection
- Reprint of publication Folk Art from the Global Village
- Interviews with artists, artist families, community members for first-person narratives to include in *Multiple Visions*

As a result of our various Girard projects of the past six years....

- We have become part of the community of scholarship about Girard, contributing to Girard's and MOIFA's legacy
- Our collaborations have helped us build connections with other art and design organizations, including Vitra Design Museum, High Museum of Art, Newfields, St. John's College, Miller/Knoll archives, Henry Ford Museum, St. Louis Art Museum
- We have seen increased visibility among a new audience: an international community of designers
- We work productively in a mutually beneficial partnership with Girard Studio
- We established a new mechanism for working with cultural advisors
- We are embarking on a conservation plan, to provide guidelines for the preservation of Multiple Visions for future visitors to enjoy
- We are creating priorities and timelines for new interpretation of *Multiple Visions*
